

# **Children’s Art Competition “Peaceful Towns”: Application Guidelines**

## **1. Summary**

Mayors for Peace will host an art competition on the theme of “Peaceful Towns” targeted at children from 6 to 15 years old who live in Mayors for Peace member cities. The grand-prize picture, selected by the judges, will be printed on Mayors for Peace plastic folders, which will be distributed at various events to raise awareness of the importance of peace education.

## **2. Applicant Requirements**

Children from 6 to 15 years old who live in Mayors for Peace member cities

## **3. Artwork Requirements**

- B4-sized (257mm×364mm) flat artwork which can be scanned. Materials are not limited.
- Artworks must be made by the applicants themselves and not have been submitted to other competitions.

## **4. Application Details**

### (1) Required application materials

- (i) Application form (Please attach the form on the back of the submission.)
- (ii) Artwork

### (2) Application procedure

Applicants should send the required application materials mentioned in 4-(1) to the city hall of the Mayors for Peace member city where they live. The member city will then convert all artworks and application forms received from applicants to PDF format, and send the PDFs to the Mayors for Peace Secretariat by email. After the grand prize is decided, the Mayors for Peace Secretariat will have the member city with the grand prize send the original artwork to the Secretariat.

### (3) Application deadline

Thursday, December 20, 2018

## **5. Schedule of the Program**

- (1) Application period: October 1 (Mon.) to December 20 (Thurs.), 2018
- (2) Announcement of selection results: Late January (on the Mayors for Peace website)
- (3) Creation of plastic folders: February

## **6. Selection Details**

Through careful screening by the Mayors for Peace Secretariat, the grand prize and two outstanding works will be selected. A certificate for the grand prize and 20 plastic folders on which the grand-prize artwork is printed will be presented to the prize winner. As for the outstanding performance prize winners, a certificate and a commemorative gift will be presented.

## **7. Notes**

- (1) An applicant will be able to submit one art work only.
- (2) The submission must not infringe on the rights of a third party, such as copyright (including that for animated characters), trademarks, and the right of publicity.
- (3) The right to use submitted artworks is owned by the Mayors for Peace Secretariat. The submitted artworks will not be returned.
- (4) As for the grand prize and the outstanding performance prize, the creators' artworks, names, ages, member cities, and messages regarding their works will be posted on the Mayors for Peace website.
