■US Conference of Mayors Adopts Resolution in Support of 2020 Vision

[Baltimore, US, June 20]

A resolution sponsored by US members of Mayors for Peace has been adopted at the 79th US Conference of Mayors annual meeting. Prior to adoption, it was endorsed by UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon, the first UN chief to address the USCM. The resolution supports the Secretary-General's Five Point Plan for Nuclear Disarmament and Nonproliferation; calls for the US nuclear arms budget to be slashed; and pledges USCM support for the 5000-members goals.
