■Nagasaki Mayor Calls for North East Asian Nuclear Weapon Free Zone

On August 3, Mayor Taue of Nagasaki, Vice President of Mayors for Peace, met with Foreign Minister Matsumoto and called on the Japanese government to work toward the creation of a nuclear weapon-free zone in the Northeast Asia covering Japan and the Korean Peninsula. Mayor Taue submitted the signatures of 103 mayors in Japan in support of this proposal to the Foreign Ministry in Tokyo. This initiative has been promoted by Peace Depot, an NPO dealing with peace and disarmament issues.

■Mayors for Peace in Peru march in solidarity with Hiroshima and Nagasaki [Lima, Peru, August 6]

Over one hundred people marched through the streets of La Victoria, a new member city of Mayors for Peace in Peru, to commemorate A-bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki. In the city hall of La Victoria, an event called "A Thousand Cranes for Peace", organized by the Women Network of Local Authorities of Lima and Callao (MUALIC) together with Mayors for Peace, was held.

Mayors of the Lima municipalities of San Borja, Miraflores, San Martin de Porres, Surquillo and metropolitan Lima and Miraflores, folded paper cranes and called for peace and nuclear disarmament on the march. The

movement was led by the Mayor of La Victoria, Alberto Sánchez Aizcorbe, who launched white balloons to the sky as an expression of peace from Peru to the world.

■U.S. Conference of Mayors issues Mayors for Peace Recruitment Appeal

On July 29, the U.S. Conference of Mayors (USCM) for the first time sent a recruitment letter on behalf of Mayors for Peace to its full membership of nearly 1,200 mayors of cities with populations over 30,000 as part of the international Mayors for Peace drive to reach 5,000 members. The letter, on USCM letterhead, was signed by Mayor Donald Plusquellic of Akron Ohio, a Mayors for Peace Vice-President and USCM Past President, Mayor Jean Quan of Oakland California, new Chair of the USCM International Affairs Committee, and 13 additional Mayors for Peace members from across the country. We hope this USCM initiative will inspire additional national mayoral associations to issue similar recruitment letters.
