■Mayors for Peace participated in the OPANAL seminar on the Nuclear Weapon Free Zones [Mexico City, February 14-15]

Mayors for Peace was invited to the Seminar marking the 45th anniversary of the Treaty of Tlatelolco. Participants from more than 30 countries assembled to learn about the history of the Treaty of Tlatelolco and debated about the future role of the Nuclear Weapon Free Zones (NWFZ) to achieve complete nuclear disarmament. The Seminar was organized by OPANAL, the Agency for the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons in Latin America and the Caribbean, based in Mexico City.

- Children & Teens, Imagine a World Free of Nuclear Weapons [deadline: April 30, 2012]

The United Nations Office for Disarmament Affairs (UNODA) has launched a disarmament education contest for young people, entitled "Art for Peace 2012". Contestants are encouraged to watch a short video film online, then to imagine a world free of nuclear weapons. Based on their musings, young people are asked to create and upload original artwork to the online site. Youth, ages 5 through 17, are being given the opportunity to use their creative talents to draw, paint, sketch, use pens, pencils, crayons, charcoal, oil, acrylic paint or water colors to imagine a world free of nuclear weapons, without wars, without bombs, without fear. The most important aspect of this activity is to provide a platform for young people to learn about this global issue and use their creative talents to become involved.

Your encouragement for children and teens in your city to participate in this contest would be appreciated.

■Please support the petition drive for a nuclear weapons convention

The next step in abolishing all nuclear weapons by 2020 is to negotiate a nuclear weapons convention. A nuclear weapons convention will prohibit the acquisition, development, possession, deployment and use of nuclear weapons and all related activities.

At our Executive Conference in Granollers, Spain in November 2011, we agreed to promote a global grassroots petition drive through which all member cities can call for an immediate start to negotiations on a nuclear weapons convention. As of March 1, 2012, we had collected a total of 334,796 signatures.

We are planning to submit signatures collected by April 2012 to the UN at the first Preparatory Committee Meeting for the 2015 NPT Review Conference in May 2012 in Vienna, Austria.

Please actively promote this petition drive in your city. Let's gather millions of signatures and make our voices heard. (The petition is available for printing or online at the links below.)

■ Mayors for Peace member cities - 5,136 cities in 153 countries/regions

Thanks to your invaluable support, as of March 1, the number of member cities reached 5,136 with 11 new members. As a result of sending a recruitment letter to non-member cities in South Korea at the end of December as well as the kind support from the Consul General of South Korea in Hiroshima, two cities from South Korea joined.

Four municipalities joined in Japan and the total number of Japanese member cities reached 1,105.

Two cities from Thailand joined as a result of recruitment by two *hibakusha* from Nagasaki who visited Thailand to hold exhibitions and share their testimonies. They brought letters to each mayor from the mayor of Nagasaki. They have been assigned as the "Special Communicators for a World without Nuclear Weapons" by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan.

As our recruitment drive will continue, we would be most grateful if you could invite your fellow mayors who are not yet members to join us.
