## ■Mayors for Peace forges close ties with Kazakh cities and government

[Kurchatov, Kazakhstan, March 17]

On March 17, a conference organized by the governor of of the East Kazakhstan Region was held within the former Semipalatinsk Nuclear Test Site or 'Polygon' in the scientists' town of Kurchatov. A European delegation of Mayors for Peace, headed by Mayor Luc Dehaene of Ypres (Belgium), Chairman of the Board of the 2020 Vision Campaign Association and Vice President of Mayors for Peace, and including Mayor Ivan Knez, Biograd na Moru (Croatia), Vice President of Mayors for Peace and Mayor Thore Vestby of Frogn (Norway), Associate Member of the Campaign Association, stayed four days and received a warm reception in Kazakhstan, opened a new Mayors for Peace office in Semey, and developed plans for activities at the East Kazakhstan Region level and nationally. The event closed with a membership ceremony that welcomed nine new cities into Mayors for Peace, including Kurchatov.

### ■FLACMA approved with unanimity a Mayors for Peace motion

[Santiago de Chile, March 20]

The Executive Bureau of the Federation of Latin American and Caribbean Cities, Municipalities and Local government associations (FLACMA) approved with unanimity a Mayors for Peace motion calling for Latin America and the Caribbean to give "high priority and assign resources to involve local governments and civil society with the intention to 'convene a High Level conference to discuss and identify the ways and methods to eliminate nuclear weapons as soon as possible." This marked the start of the "VI Latin American and Caribbean Conference of Local Governments" attended by 1,500 delegates from 30 countries across Latin America.

Both organizations declared its support to Mayors for Peace 2020 Vision Campaign for the elimination of all nuclear weapons by the year 2020.

## ■Manchester hosts UK and Ireland Mayors for Peace Working Group

[Manchester, UK, March 29]

The Lord Mayor of Manchester, Councillor Harry Lyons, hosted the biannual UK and Ireland Mayors for Peace Working Group in Manchester Town Hall on March 29. The meeting discussed how to develop the organization in the UK and Ireland given that Mayors in both countries have, on the whole, a more ceremonial than executive role. A long discussion took place on strategies to deepen and increase membership. The meeting heard that a number of members had agreed to pay voluntary invoices, which would be shortly sent to the 2020 Vision Secretariat. The successful promotion of the Hiroshima-Nagasaki A-bomb exhibition would be encouraged, with it going to Fife, Rotherham, Newcastle, Dublin and to London boroughs in 2012. It was also agreed to investigate the development of an annual event and joint applications to charitable trust foundations for project funding.

## ■Please support the petition drive for a nuclear weapons convention

The next step in abolishing all nuclear weapons by 2020 is to negotiate a nuclear weapons convention.

A nuclear weapons convention will prohibit the acquisition, development, possession, deployment and use of nuclear weapons and all related activities.

At our Executive Conference in Granollers, Spain in November 2011, we agreed to promote a global grassroots petition drive through which all member cities can call for an immediate start to negotiations on a nuclear weapons convention. As of April 1, 2012, we had collected a total of 390,544 signatures.

We are planning to submit signatures collected so far to the UN at the first Preparatory Committee Meeting for the 2015 NPT Review Conference in May 2012 in Vienna, Austria.

We will continue this petition drive even after that.

Please actively promote this petition drive in your city. For example, the City of Hiroshima set up petition booths at the lobby of the city hall and other municipal offices on April 2 as well as venues of events organized by the city. Please inform us of your city's efforts in this petition drive as well.

Let's gather millions of signatures and make our voices heard. (The petition is available for printing or online at the links below.)

### ■ Mayors for Peace member cities - 5,221 cities in 153 countries/regions

Thanks to your invaluable support, as of April 1, the number of member cities reached 5,221 with 86 new members. As a result of sending a recruitment letter to all non-member cities/municipalities in Japan in February, 34 cities from Japan joined.

As a result of the recruitment drive on the FLACMA conference, 29 cities, including 10 from Chile, seven from Argentina, seven from Paraguay, two from Ecuador and one each from Bolivia, Dominican Republic and Uruguay joined.

Nine cities from Kazakhstan joined thanks to the kind assistance of the Administration of the East Kazakhstan on the occasion of the conference held in Kazakhstan in March.

Five cities from Colombia joined as a result of their meeting with the mayor of Nagasaki when a mayoral delegation from Colombia visited Nagasaki in February.

As our recruitment drive will continue, we would be most grateful if you could invite your fellow mayors who are not yet members to join us.
