

Revision to the Covenant of Mayors for Peace (Japanese and English versions)

1 Points revised

In order to respond to the increasing number of member cities and improve the activities of Mayors for Peace in the following years, some revisions to the covenant regarding the Secretariat, such as establishing a Secretary General and Under-Secretary General, have been proposed.

In case of the inability of the Secretary General to carry out the duties of the office, or if the post is vacant, the Under-Secretary General shall fulfill the duties of the Secretary General.</u></p>
