r ive Hibakusha (survivors of the atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki), all officially designated by the Japanese Ministry of Foreign Affairs as "Special Communicators for a World without Nuclear Weapons", will visit London 3-4 October as part of a three month "Global Voyage for a Nuclear Free World" organised by Japan-based NGO, Peace Boat. The survivors will share their individual experiences of the effects of nuclear weapons on their cities. The symposium will bring together commentators, campaigners, policy makers.and emergency service providers for a discussion on the humanitarian effects of nuclear weapons and their potential impact on cities in the UK and Ireland.
